Let me get search through my stock but I'm about 99.999% sure I've got one. As far as interchangeability, the Repairer's Reference has the Balance Completes pulled out and put right at the front of the book, thinking that many times that is the repair. Page 26. I show that the 210, 211, and 212 all have a common balance complete.

Helpless Jenneke, do you need full 210 movements or do you too have some to be repaired? I like the watch, by the way.
