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The dial isn't substituted, but repainted. If a dial got damage (from water or radium burn) it was normal to do a redial. They removed the paint from the (brass?) dial and used stamps to get it spickandspan again. Sometimes the redialer didnt have the correct templates... and/or he worked from memory.

Maybe a watchmaker or jeweler can open the back for you. A picture from the movement and inside case back would be helpful for identifying it.
