Regarding your question between the Airflight and the version II you can have a look at the watch which they are showing on that side. The II is the later model with different lugs, just compare. The Airflight was introduced about 1958 and lasted at least until 1969. At some point in time the model was adopted to the taste of the new decade. So I'd say your watch is from the late 60s.

In the perfect condition it is, with the box and the for sure original band I would say that people

would pay up to \$1000. My personal opinion is that it is not really worth that money, but that is my personal opinion. Minimum money you should get for it is \$400.
