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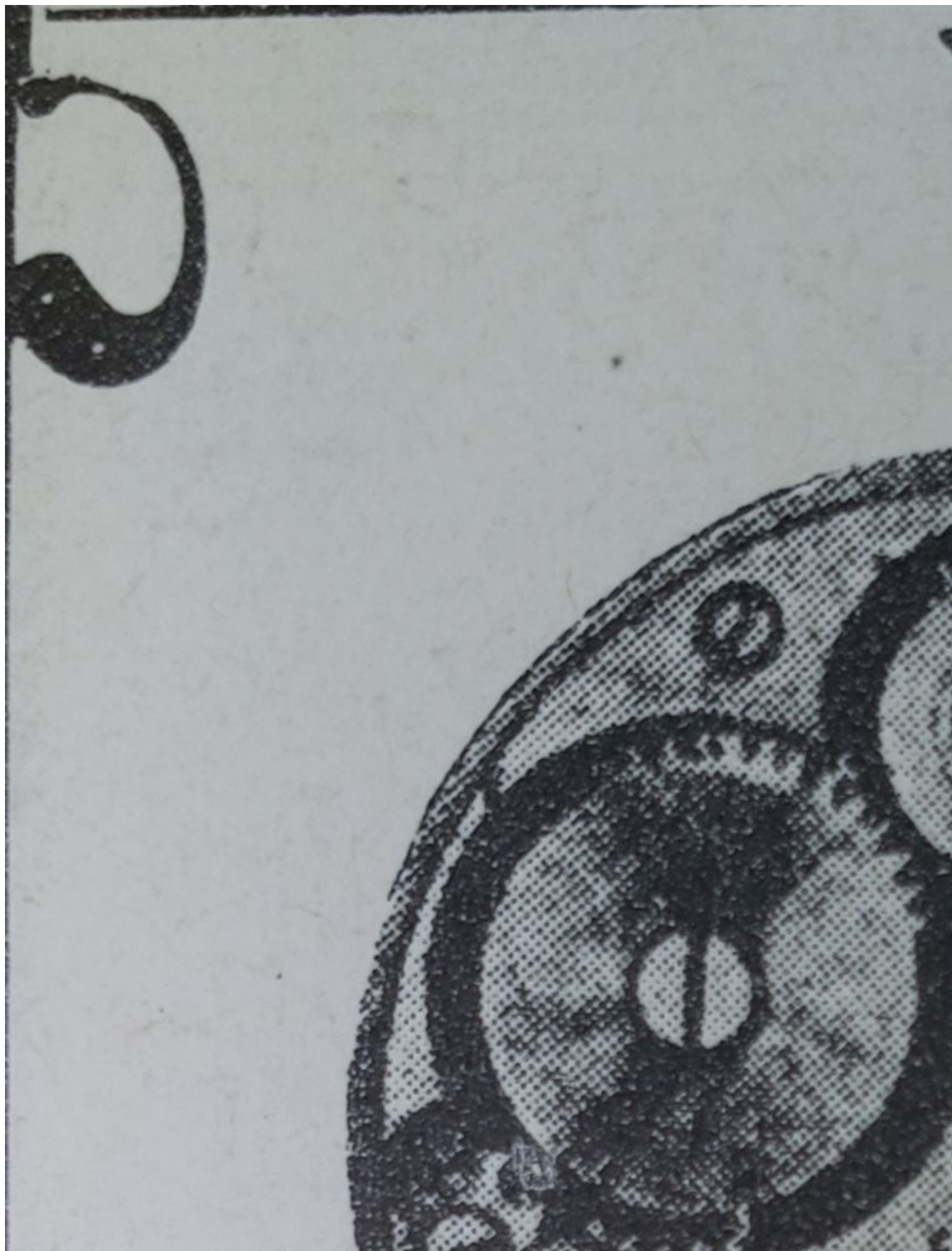
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I never could get that number to show photos so I never saw the Favre signed movement.
