Some models evolved over time. This seems particularly true of out of the ordinary niche models. My impression is that what's found in the Master Book represents the most recent version of any given model. I'll post a few examples later. No opinion on this watch, but with a hand carved fancy jeweled case, I would suggest the possibility that the nearest match may be the correct ID.
