Trial and error with a white A4 paper. I dont have autocad... Thinking from a 3-dimensional box to a foldable flat blueprint was hard. Edges wrong length, triangles wrong way. Glad I had a scissor and tape.


How to fold (version 1)

Put together (version 1):







To make it nicer I might put brown book linen on it. Or do you have a suggestion?


I started with the watch holder. Foam, cardboard and the black velvet back of a photo frame.



And a zoom on Lola's lap shows the texture:





I glued a light brown linen on it.


Next step, make a black velvet watch holder.

Ready for the velvet! Again, fiddling with small pieces.


And tadaaa! The end result.

Maybe i will give the white inside a lick of paint. But for now, done and dusted.


Next project... give the carre a leather jacket.






