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
Passe-partout white box.

And a zoom on Lola's lap shows the texture:

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



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
Well, I am not a certified watch box maker. For sure I wouldn't be hired for the Gruen box making company. :lol: But, next step finished.

I glued a light brown linen on it.


Next step, make a black velvet watch holder.

And tadaaa! The end result.


Maybe i will give the white inside a lick of paint. But for now, done and dusted.

Next project... give the carre a leather jacket.





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It is made out of a thick chipboard with nice paper coverings.


