I tried it and they came up with the 312 which is for most likely the right one as it is a hearing aid battery. These are Zinc air cells which have a different characteristic than the normally used silver oxide batteries for watches. I guess this old model was a mercury cell and as such is nowadays banned.

Gary, most helpful would be measuring diameter and height of the battery at a tenth of millimeter. Then I should be able to find the correct modern equivalent...

OK, in this case I'd go with a SR616 which is also sold as 321. It measures 6.8mm diameter and 1.65mm height. This is the smallest common battery that should fit.
There is one smaller battery with 1.4mm height which is the SR614 also known as 339. That one is hard to get.
