Borel also has what is one of the most valuable tools for tracking down parts but also in some cases understanding the relation of watches to manufacturer. The interchange database - <http://cgi.julesborel.com/> Note: if nothing shows the first time, hit the back button and try again. Their server is funny in the way it plants cookies on your computer.

A large selection of complete movements and partial movements. Often his prices are about the same as you'd see on eBay. But keep in mind that he's a watch guy and is giving good descriptions of what he's selling. Has tools too!
